"He brings years of knowledge and experience to help with our other two goalies and I have already noticed a positive change in our goaltending.

"With three of them fighting for the numberone spot, I expect them to stay sharp, not only in games but in practices.

"And it has been working."

Lee Valley Lions begin their English National League South Two campaign on Saturday August 3 and the team will be looking to build on last season's 10th-place finish.

Before then though, the Lions will also be taking part in a pre-season friendly against English National League South One side Streatham Redskins in aid of Cancer Research.

The game will take place in Streatham on August 21, with face-off scheduled for 4.30pm.
