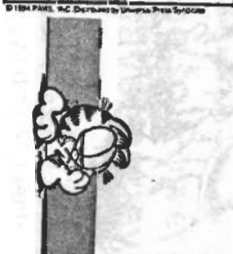

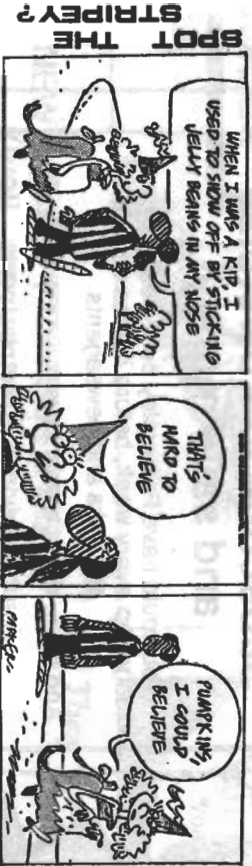
IT'S TOUGH AT THE TOP?

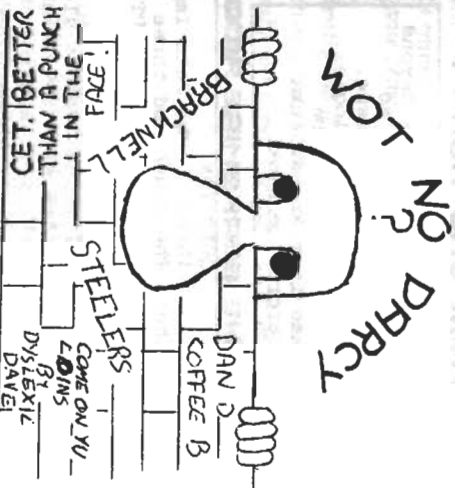

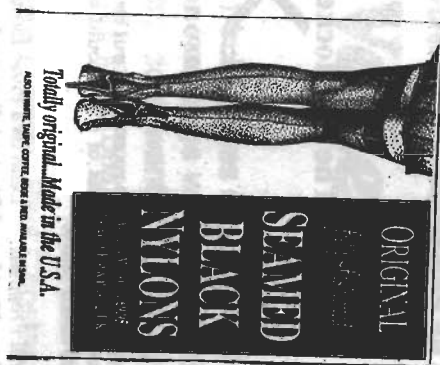

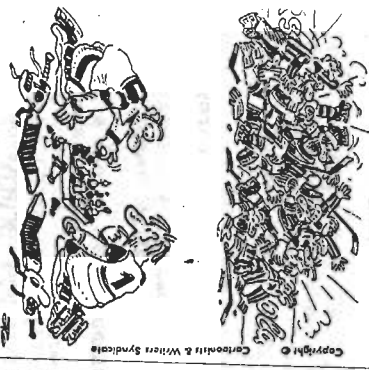
